Thoughts from Miss Ip:

I would recommend those who are going to take the exam not too rely too much on exam tips. From my point of view, the learning process is the most important part. Some accounting knowledge, such as accounting standards, applies not only to the ATE, but also the PBE, QP and your daily work. Past papers and examiners' reports are indispensable guides for students preparing for the exams. The case studies in past papers help you to apply the concepts and theory to your actual daily work, while the examiners' reports give you a better understanding of mistakes frequently made by candidates.

During the exam, time management is essential. You should have an idea of how long you can afford to spend on each part and allocate the appropriate time to each question. For myself, I allocate around 30-35 minutes for each question, and do not exceed my time limit.
